## **Advocacy Updates**

From the desk of AAPath's Deputy Director, Lydia P. Howell, MD

August is the time for the summer congressional recess when your representatives will be on home turf. This is the perfect time for you and your institutional government affairs team to meet with your representatives, learn about the impact of pathology and laboratory medicine, and discuss the issues important to you. You could even invite them to visit your clinical and research labs, meet your faculty and housestaff, and share their stories of discovery, of providing leadingedge patient care, and the passion for training bright young minds who are similarly passionate about serving their community as physicians. An alternative funding model for indirect grant support from NIH has been proposed by the Joint Associations Group (JAG), a consortium which includes the AAMC. The JAG website is accessible through the AAMC Facilities & Administrative Costs page, and includes a recording of the July 15<sup>th</sup> town hall describing their proposed model, resources explaining the model, and a form to provide feedback and questions about the details and implementation of the model.

### Residency Interview Timeline and Program Signals

#### **Program Signals**

Pathology as a specialty will continue to have 5 signals per applicant for the 2025-2026 match cycle. This decision was based on feedback from PRODS Members – thank you to everyone who completed the survey sent last August, 2024, which had over 80% program response rate, and over 80% of respondents were in favor of applicants continuing to have 5 signals.

#### **Residency Interview Timeline**

Residency Program Interview Offer Release Date: Pathology will use an initial interview offer release date of Wednesday, October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2025, at 4pm EST.

This decision was also based on feedback from PRODS – thank you to everyone who completed the survey sent in December 2024. There was strong support nationally for an initial residency interview offer date, and over 80% of respondents were in favor of this specific date.

# AAPath Quality Improvement and Patient Safety (QIPS) Scholarship Forum



**2026 QIPS Scholarship Forum Call for Abstracts** Deadline: Monday, December 1, 2025. The Pathology Residency Program Directors Sections (PRODS) will again host the AAPath QIPS Scholarship Forum in the coming academic year. The Forum was established in 2024 to further residents' and fellows' participation and success in scholarship, while raising awareness among programs to the many ways that quality improvement and patient safety (QIPS) values are being learned and applied. Abstracts should be written with the intent of improving patient safety and/or quality in the clinical environment, and may be based on residents' QI projects. The Abstract Review Committee will review submissions and select abstracts via the criteria listed on the QIPS Scholarship Forum webpage. Please encourage residents or fellows to submit their abstracts to enable the continued development of this valuable resource and scholarship opportunity!

# What's New in Academic Pathology

Academic Pathology is AAPath's fully open-access, PubMed-indexed, peer-reviewed journal and part of the world-class collection of journals and pathology resources published by Elsevier, with visibility to a global audience of academic leaders through Science Direct and Clinical Key.

Academic Pathology's 2024 impact factor increased to 1.3 (from 1.2 in 2023 and 1.0 in 2022) and the journal is now ranked 61 of 90 journals in the Pathology category – one more reason to <u>submit your manuscript</u> to AAPath's official journal!
