The SFG, established as an AAPath member group in 2017, is comprised of former academic department Chairs, who assist the AAPath in its activities and mission by participating in AAPath programs, committees, and projects; and providing advice, consultation, and mentoring to current Chairs and other members of the AAPath, and to other pathology department faculty interested in leadership roles.

As an extension to traditional SFG mentoring of aspiring and new department Chairs, the SFG is now announcing the availability of a new program for mentoring/advising sitting Chairs, who want to transition to higher administrative positions (e.g., dean, vice chancellor, health system chief executive officer, etc.). Current pathology Chairs who wish to engage in this new SFG mentoring/advising program are invited to submit their CV, along with a letter describing the administrative position(s) in which they are interested and their history of administrative service thus far. To keep the process as confidential as possible, the package should be submitted to the AAPath Office at: info@academicpathology.org. The package will then be reviewed by the AAPath SFG Executive Committee, which will then contact the applicant to discuss potential

matches to an appropriate SFG member, who has served in the same or similar role(s) to which the Chair aspires. In addition to providing mentoring/advising, the SFG mentor may serve as a reference or write a letter of support if their experience and endorsement are relevant to the career opportunity.

2024 AAPath Compensation Study Now Open

The 2024 Academic Pathology Faculty and Administrators Compensation Benchmarking Survey is <u>NOW OPEN!</u> The study platform is designed to confidentially collect data from participating departments and transform into a member-interrogated reporting system when the data collection period is closed. For participating departments that complete the required questions (to be eligible to access data), the anonymized and aggregated results are sortable by a variety of self-selected metrics. Now entering our third year of data collection, AAPath believes these studies address a critical need for members to have useful comparative regional and national data to assist in recruitment, retention, and discussions with institutional leadership.

Advocacy Update

From the desk of AAPath's Deputy Director, Lydia P. Howell, MD

It is Spring— a season of change. Change and uncertainty have become a bit of a certainty over the past several months given the many new executive orders, changes in government programs, dismantling of the Department of Education, and looming loss of federal funding. Here are a couple of helpful info fact sheet resources from the <u>AAMC</u> that can support your local advocacy efforts, followed by our advocacy activities and summer programming to support our member departments:

- AAMC Policy Priorities in the 119th Congress two-pager, outlining the value of academic medicine, AAMC-member institutions' missions, and AAMC's key academic medicine policy areas for the new congress
- The Impact of Drastic Cuts to NIH-Funded Research on U.S. Medical Schools onepager, which summarizes results from a brief survey of 111 U.S. medical schools on the potential impacts of a standard 15% facilities and administrative (F&A) cost rate for all institutions

Lab Week is a golden opportunity for advocacy: April 20-26 is National Medical Laboratory Professionals Week ("Lab Week 2025"), the perfect time to raise visibility of your clinical and research laboratories, faculty and staff and celebrate their important contributions to the health of your communities. As AAMC continues to emphasize, local and regional advocacy is an important and impactful strategy and is something that every medical school – and department of pathology and laboratory medicine – should be doing to influence change. To help you share important stories about the value of academic pathology now and in future, AAPath is collecting your publicity and recruitment activities to serve as a resource to our members when they seek to illustrate the amazing work that makes academic pathology departments unique and worthy of support. FDA regulation of LDTs: Yes, this issue is still on the list – and like everyone else, we await the court's decision regarding the lawsuits filed by AMP and ACLA challenging the FDA's regulation of LDTs. On March 6th, AAPath hosted a webinar on the status of this lawsuit following the recent court hearing in February. AMP's Director of Public Policy and Advocacy Annie Scrimenti and University of Washington's Eric Konnick, MD, chair of AMP's Professional Relations Committee, provided an excellent update on the recent legal hearing in February with thoughts on what will happen next. Don't forget that labs are still expected to meet the first FDA compliance deadline which is coming up on May 6th.

The AAPath Advocacy Committee is delighted to welcome representation from AAPath's new Communications Professionals Affinity Group: Effective and strategic communications is an important part of advocacy. The Advocacy Committee has therefore recently extended an invitation to have a representative from AAPath's relatively new affinity group for departmental Communications Professionals join the Advocacy Committee. We look forward to learning more from the Communications Professionals Group and to their ideas and contributions for advocacy. Advocacy Session at the AAPath 2025 Annual Meeting: Make the trip to Denver and join us for these great sessions in July:

- Friends of Pathology Award: We are delighted that the National Kidney Foundation (NKF) will be receiving our Friends of Pathology Award this year in recognition of their cross-disciplinary work over many years to reconsider race-based aspects of kidney function tests, and for inviting AAPath participation in their Laboratory Engagement Initiative which highlighted the pivotal role clinical laboratory testing plays in guiding the most appropriate and equitable patient care.
- Healthcare counsel Jane Pine Wood, JD, will take the spotlight in the Advocacy Session and discuss "Hot Topics in Washington." A previous recipient of AAPath's Friends of Pathology Award in 2015, Ms. Wood will share perspectives from her 37 years of experience providing legal representation to clinical and anatomic laboratories, hospitals, health systems, physicians, professional societies and others. Revisit her 2016 Brief Report on "Opportunities for Academic Pathology – Thoughts and Perspectives of a Legal Observer" published in Academic Pathology.
- APEX's session: "A Year of Legal Uncertainty and Change for Pathologists and Laboratory Medicine" will follow and will be an excellent complement to this session. Be sure to join us in July in Denver for both these sessions.


