## **Advocacy Updates**

From the desk of AAPath's Deputy Director, Lydia P. Howell, MD

August is the time for the summer recess of Congress. We hope that you and your school's government affairs colleagues have been able to connect with your elected representatives during this month to share the important and impactful work that you do and to garner support for the NIH budget, medical student loan support, Medicare payments, and the many other issues that are important to academic pathology and academic medicine in general.

Here are a few updates on resources to support your own grassroots advocacy, throughout the year as well as other advocacy activities by AAPath:

- New resources from the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC):
  - New information <u>about the AAMC's advocacy</u> priorities for the 119th Congress is now available on the recently updated <u>advocacy and policy</u> section of the AAMC website.
     AAMC's priorities include many issues that are important to AAPath: <u>Strengthening</u>

- the health care workforce, protecting patients' access to health care, promoting funding for health and scientific research, and supporting training for future physicians and researchers.
- AAMC's <u>Value of Academic Medicine</u> website has also been updated with new information and resources, including stories of how academic medicine impacts communities nationwide.
- Two programs with interactive experiences and role-playing are designed to help you
  educate your Congressional representatives, state and local officials, donors,
  community members, and others outside of academic medicine on the challenges
  within medical education and its funding mechanisms: Project Medical Education
  (www.aamc.org/advocacy-policy/project-medical-education) and Research-Based
  Project Medical Education: (www.aamc.org/advocacy-policy/project-medical-education/research-pme).
- <u>National effort to improve pediatric reference intervals</u>: AAPath has signed on to a
  letter to Senate Majority Leader John Thune and Minority Leader Charles Schumer, and to
  the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor, Health, and Human Services Chair
  Robert Aderholt and Ranking Member Rosa DeLauro requesting that Centers for Disease
  Control and Prevention begin to address this issue, and asking that \$10 million is added to
  the budget to support this project. This letter was initiated by our friends at Association for
  Diagnostic and Laboratory Medicine (ADLM) and has been co-signed by almost 50 other
  professional organizations.
- <u>Support the full proposal for NIH funding</u>: Don't forget to send a letter available at this link from FASEB (<a href="https://www.faseb.org/partnerships-and-outreach/legislative-action-center">https://www.faseb.org/partnerships-and-outreach/legislative-action-center</a>) to support the NIH budget of \$48.7 billion for fiscal year 2026 which has been approved by the US Senate Appropriations Committee. The President's budget has an \$18 billion reduction, which would be detrimental to the discovery and application of new knowledge to advance health. 

## 2024 AAPath Compensation Benchmarking Studies Completed

As a reminder, the study platform is designed to confidentially collect data from participating departments and transform into a member-interrogated reporting system when the data collection period is closed. For participating departments that complete the required questions (to be eligible to access data), the anonymized and aggregated results are sortable by a variety of self-selected metrics.

Now completing our third year of data collection, AAPath believes these studies address a critical need for members to have useful comparative regional and national data to assist in recruitment, retention, and discussions with institutional leadership. The strength of the data is only as good as the participation level, so in response to departmental feedback, we are extending the 2025 data collection period for 2025 data, scheduled for November 2025 through April 2026.

2026 QIPS Scholarship Forum Call for Abstracts <u>Deadline: Monday, December 1, 2025</u>.

PRODS will again host the AAPath QIPS Scholarship Forum in the coming academic year. The Forum was established in 2024 to further residents' and fellows' participation and success in scholarship, while raising awareness among programs to the many ways that quality improvement and patient safety (QIPS) values are being learned and applied. The Forum furthers the goals of ACGME's PDPQ program, in which several pathology residency programs participated in 2023 and 2024.

Abstracts should be written with the intent of improving patient safety and/or quality in the clinical environment, and may be based on residents' QI projects. The Abstract Review Committee will review submissions and select abstracts via the criteria listed on the QIPS Scholarship Forum webpage. Please encourage residents or fellows to submit their abstracts no later than Monday, December 1st, to enable the continued development of this valuable resource and scholarship opportunity!

For reference, abstracts for the 2025 QIPS Scholarship Forum were published as a <u>supplement to Academic Pathology's Volume 12, Issue 2.</u> Congratulations to those authors who achieved this milestone in scholarship and thank you for modeling the value of QIPS learning to other training programs!

The Society of '67 Pathology Trainee Project Grants in Health Services Research and Education 2026 Program is now open for applications!

Applicants must have a faculty sponsor/advisor who is a full-time faculty member in the Pathology Department (AAPath member department) at their institution. If invited to submit a full proposal, a letter of sponsorship/recommendation from the Chair of the Pathology Department (for medical students) or Program Director of the pathology training program (for residents/fellows) at their institution must be provided. For the purposes of this grant award program, the eligible applicant must be listed as the principal investigator.

The Project Grants will fund innovative projects that are relevant to health services research or education, including but not limited to healthcare quality, costs, and/or access related to pathology services. Two categories of grants will be considered: Research or Education. Funding is up to \$5,000 for one calendar year.

- Research Project Grants: To investigate a question and/or to develop a technology in pathology/lab medicine services that improves healthcare quality, cost, or access.
- Education Project Grants: To develop an educational program or offering in pathology/lab medicine services focused on improving healthcare quality, cost, or access.



## What's New in Academic Pathology

Academic Pathology is AAPath's fully open-access, PubMed-indexed, peer-reviewed journal and part of the world-class collection of journals and pathology resources published by Elsevier, with visibility to a global audience of academic leaders through Science Direct and Clinical Key. Academic Pathology's 2024 impact factor increased to 1.3 (from 1.2 in 2023 and 1.0 in 2022) and the journal is now ranked 61 of 90 journals in the Pathology category – one more reason to submit your manuscript to AAPath's official journal!

\*AAPath was invited four years ago (2021) to participate in Equity Matters, a joint initiative of the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) and the Council of Medical Specialty Societies (CMSS). AAPath joined nearly three dozen other medical specialty organizations invited to participate in the 18-month long program that met monthly for large and small group discussions on educational modules and culminated with an organizational capstone project. The purpose of this initiative was to create learning environments that are inclusive and equitable, so that all trainees and faculty thrive. AAPath's capstone project, led by Debra Leonard, MD, PhD (University of Vermont) and Mel Limson, PhD (AAPath), focused on developing a toolkit of best practices for improving equity across academic ranks for women in academic pathology departments. Based on survey results and interviews of select departments in 2022, this paper demonstrates that in academic pathology women faculty achieve promotion to full professors as much as men faculty, with data indicating that equity was driven by the intention of the Chair and culture of the department. This equity for women faculty achieving full professor rank and tenure is relevant for increasing the numbers of women in higher leadership roles, such as a Chair or Dean.
