ADVOCACY UPDATES

Advocacy Updates

From the desk of AAPath's Deputy Director, Lydia P. Howell, MD


The summer Congressional recess has ended and vacation season is over -- opportunities for advocacy have therefore been ramping up. Here is what has been happening in September:

- <u>Supporting the FAIR model for indirect costs</u>: AAPath joined 164 organizations who signed a letter to Senate and House appropriators expressing support for the new and more transparent model for Facilities and Administrative expenses (aka "indirects") developed by the <u>Joint Association's Group (JAG) on Indirect Costs</u>. - <u>Supporting physician-scientists</u>: A workshop organized by the National Academy of
 Medicine (NAM) and the American Junior Investigator Association (AJIA), "<u>Sustaining the
 Biomedical Workforce</u>: <u>Innovative Pathways for Retaining and Supporting PhysicianScientists</u>," was held in Washington DC on September 9, 2025 to brainstorm easily
 implementable solutions that would address the leaky pipeline of early career physicianscientists. AAPath was an invited participant and represented by Deputy Director Lydia
 Howell, MD. Many ideas were shared during the breakout sessions and are currently being
 refined. <u>The recording of the workshop is now available</u>. We will share next steps, as well
 as the planned published proceedings, as these are formalized.
- AAMC's new state-level advocacy function: The current Administration has a strong focus on decentralization with more decisions related to policy and programs happening on the state level. AAMC has therefore begun a new state advocacy function which will focus on four core issues: Medicaid, Graduate Medical Education and Workforce, Higher Education, Medicaid, and 340B Drug Pricing Program. They plan to convene working groups to strengthen collaboration across institutions, share insights, and provide resources that prepare members to respond to incoming state policies, particularly those that may later emerge at the federal level or cut across several states. As this new program unfolds, we will be passing along updates in these areas so that you (and your institutional AAMC Governmental Relations Representatives) can be more effective in your own state advocacy.

As always, we appreciate your engagement and support regarding these important issues that affect our departments and the patients and learners that we serve.

AAPath 2025 COMPENSATION SURVEY

2025 AAPath Compensation Benchmarking
Studies to Launch in November



Chairs, Vice Chairs and APEX members are invited to join a webinar developed by AAPath's Practice & Management Committee and APEX Council about how to submit academic pathology compensation data and how to leverage this specialty data in conversations with hospital and medical center executives, even when your institution uses other national benchmarks, like MGMA and AAMC.

Webinar: AAPath Compensation Survey – How does it help me? Insights and Leverage Save the Date: Friday, October 24th at 12:30pm-1:30pm ET (11:30am CT/10:30am MT/9:30am PT) The Zoom registration link will be sent to the Chairs and APEX members only.

As a reminder, the study platform is designed to confidentially collect data from participating departments and transform into a member-interrogated reporting system when the data collection period is closed. For participating departments that complete the required questions (to be eligible to access data), the anonymized and aggregated results are sortable by a variety of self-selected metrics.

Now, with two academic years of data collection (since 2022), AAPath believes these studies address a critical need for members to have useful comparative regional and national data to assist in recruitment, retention, and discussions with institutional leadership. The strength of the data is only as good as the participation level, so in response to departmental feedback, we are opening the 2025 data collection period earlier and leaving it open longer (from November 2025 through April 2026). Chairs and APEX members with data entry privileges will receive an email alert with instructions from Dynamic Benchmarking, or you may go directly to <u>start data entry here</u>, in early November. To make participation in the 2025 study easier, no new questions will be added and, if you participated previously, data may be quickly copied from a prior year.



SFG Members Publish Second Handbook



What's New in Academic Pathology

Academic Pathology is AAPath's fully open-access, PubMed-indexed, peer-reviewed journal and part of the world-class collection of journals and pathology resources published by Elsevier, with visibility to a global audience of academic leaders through Science Direct and Clinical Key.

Academic Pathology's 2024 impact factor increased to 1.3 (from 1.2 in 2023 and 1.0 in 2022) and the journal is now ranked 61 of 90 journals in the Pathology category – one more reason to submit your manuscript to AAPath's official journal!

The Forum was established in 2024 to further residents' and fellows' participation and success in scholarship, while raising awareness among programs to the many ways that quality improvement and patient safety (QIPS) values are being learned and applied. The Forum furthers the goals of ACGME's PDPQ program, in which several pathology residency programs participated in 2023 and 2024.

Abstracts should be written with the intent of improving patient safety and/or quality in the clinical environment, and may be based on residents' QI projects. The Abstract Review Committee will review submissions and select abstracts via the criteria listed on the QIPS Scholarship Forum webpage. Please encourage residents or fellows to submit their abstracts no later than Monday, December 1st, to enable the continued development of this valuable resource and scholarship opportunity!


