AAPath 2025 COMPENSATION SURVEY

AAPath 2025 Compensation Benchmarking Study Opens Today!

The AAPath Compensation Benchmarking Survey addresses a critical need for member departments to access comparative regional and national data that informs recruitment, retention, and discussions with institutional leadership. The annual survey platform is designed to confidentially collect data from participating departments and transform into a member-interrogated reporting system when the data collection period is closed. For participating departments that complete the required questions, the anonymized and aggregated results are accessible and sortable by a variety of self-selected metrics for analysis.


The strength of the data is only as good as the participation level of the AAPath membership, so in response to departmental feedback from the past two academic years of data collection since 2022, we are opening the 2025 data collection period earlier and keeping it open longer, from today,

October 31, 2025 through March 2026. To make participation in the 2025 study easier, no new questions will be added and, if you participated previously, data may be quickly copied from the previous year. Chairs and APEX members with data entry privileges will receive an email alert today with instructions from Dynamic Benchmarking, or you may go directly to **start data entry here**.

ADVOCACY UPDATES

Advocacy Updates

From the desk of AAPath's Deputy Director, Lydia P. Howell, MD

A government shut-down this past month did not mean a shut-down for AAPath's advocacy work! Here is what we have been doing to support our members:

Sign-on letters

AAPath has joined other organizations to support critical issues that affect our clinical practice, medical research and education, and patient care. Many voices together amplify the voice of the pathology and laboratory medicine. The letters are posted on the AAPath Statements and Reports webpage.

- Protecting patient access to clinical laboratory services: AAPath signed a letter initiated by the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) urging Congress to enact needed reforms to the Medicare Clinical Laboratory Fee Schedule (CLFS) through the Reforming and Enhancing Sustainable Updates to Laboratory Testing Services (RESULTS) Act (S. 2761 / H.R. 5269). This bipartisan, bicameral legislation will ensure the CLFS rate-setting process is based on up-to-date, representative and comprehensive market data, reduce administrative burden on clinical laboratories and Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), and promote diagnostic innovation by providing stability in Medicare payment.
- <u>Seeking a National Interest Exemption (NIE) from President's \$100,000 H-1B visa fee:</u> AAPath supported a letter from ASCP's Medical and Public Health Laboratory Workforce Coalition (MPHLWC) which urges the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to provide H1-B visas for the pathology and laboratory medicine workforce. The letter emphasizes the looming shortage of up to 86,000 physicians by 2036 per AAMC and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics estimate of an annual demand for laboratory professionals at around 22,600 positions per year. The AAMC, the American Council on Education, and the Association of American Universities have also circulated a letter opposing the \$100K H1-B visa fee and requesting industry-wide exemptions for healthcare workers and educators.
 - Update: New Guidance on H1-B Visas: On October 20th, information, guidance, and related procedures were published on the <u>U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services</u> website for the Presidential Proclamation, "Restriction on Entry of Certain Nonimmigrant Workers," which significantly reformed the H-1B visa program as of September 19, 2025. Note that currently there are no industry-wide exemptions (i.e., no exemptions for physicians or laboratory workers, or other workers in shortage industries – each individual must submit for an exemption).
- Support for the NIH budget: AAPath was among many other organizations who supported a letter from the AAMC and from the Ad Hoc Group for Medical Research to the House and Senate Committees on Appropriations urging that the NIH receives no less than \$47.2 billion in addition to funding for the Advanced Research Projects Agency for Health (ARPA-H).

Are you attending the AAMC Annual Meeting: Learn Serve Lead (LSL) in San Antonio?

 If you are attending LSL this weekend, AAPath would appreciate feedback from you about issues and activities at that meeting that could be helpful in influencing AAPath's programming and goals. This is especially important right now, since AAPath is currently engaging in a strategic planning process and will be updating its next 3-year strategic plan at the Winter Council meeting in January 2026. We therefore hope you will take a moment to share your thoughts and impressions from Learn Serve Lead – or from any of AAMC's affinity group calls or meetings that you may participate in throughout the year. Council/Committee considerations.

And don't forget – connect with your university or health system's government relations team to share your concerns, expertise, and help with advocacy. AAMC is encouraging local advocacy and has recently launched support sessions for state-level advocacy to strengthen collaboration across institutions, share insights, and provide resources that prepare members to respond to incoming state policies, particularly those that may later emerge at the federal level or

ANNOUNCING NEW SOCIETY MEMBERSHIP

AAPath Becomes a Society Member of the Academy for Radiology and Biomedical Imaging Research!

AAPath recently joined the Academy for Radiology and Biomedical Imaging Research (the "Academy") as the first Society Member outside of the radiology and imaging community. The Academy's mission is to advance research in medical imaging by advocating for consistent federal investment for medical imaging research. As an advocacy organization representing the imaging research community with a diverse membership including 22 imaging societies, 50 academic radiology departments, 100 patient groups, and 7 industry partners, the Academy works to increase resources and opportunities for imaging research and promotes the translation of that research to enhance human health. Academy Executive Director Renee Cruea values the new relationship "to bring on a new diverse organization and begin engaging beyond our silos." To support organizational cooperation, Past President Chen Liu, MD, PhD (Yale University), will serve as AAPath's representative on the Academy's Board. As diagnostic medicine increasingly integrates pathology and radiology, Dr. Liu aims to explore opportunities for access and exposure to the radiology network. "I am excited about the many collaborative opportunities we have in our shared mission to advance patient care, research, and education," said Dr. Liu. "I am truly enthusiastic about being on the Board and helping to catalyze future productive collaborations."






